The current charter cap is 460

The state's charter cap was lifted in 2010. NYC was granted a maximum of 114 charters, with 57 given to each of the Board of Regents and the State University of New York (SUNY). Today, only 24 are left. However, under the 2007 cap, SUNY still has 1 charter remaining, which can go to either NYC or elsewhere in New York State. Therefore, up to 25 charters could still be opened in NYC.

The Charter Schools Institute assists the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York (SUNY) in meeting its responsibilities under the New York State Charter Schools Act of 1998 and in furthering SUNY's leading role in strengthening public education across the State.

Authorizer 2 The New York State Board of Regents

The mission of the New York State Education Department Charter School Office is to create and sustain excellent educational options for New York State families on behalf of the Board of Regents through high quality charter school authorizing, fair and transparent oversight of all charter schools, and the dissemination of innovative school designs and practices.

An institution that grants and monitors charters is called an "Authorizer."






CREDO Study And how do they perform?

The CREDO study on the impact of charter schools found that in many cases, students in charter schools experience the equivalent of many more days of learning than their peers in traditional public schools over the course of a single school year.


New York State extra days of learning
